

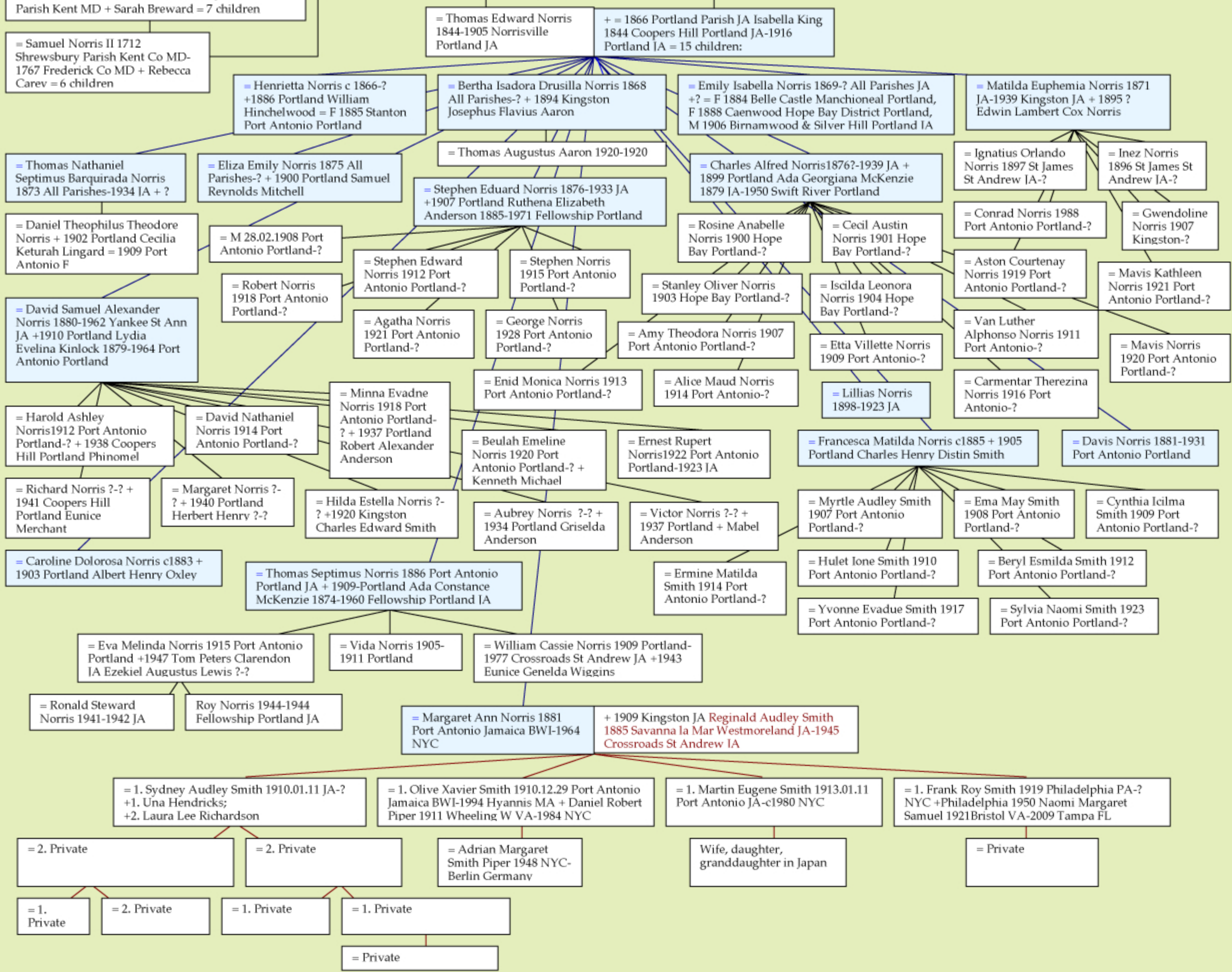

A Hindu woman born c1800 Chittagong Bengal India [now Bangladesh]. Christened Isabella King in 1815 & 1820 Portland JA. Held 12 slaves in common w/John Gough 1823 Portland JA; held 22 slaves independently in 1833 Portland JA. No Jamaica birth, marriage, death or immigration records.

*In order to distinguish the children of Isabella King (1844-1916) from their progeny, the former are represented in blue because her mother, christened as Isabella King in 1815 and 1820, was a pureblooded Hindu. Blue is the color of divinity in Hinduism.
¹The Norris family name evolved from "Norrrens," "de Noers," "de Norreis," and "le Norreys," among other variants. Some think the family stems from the Noyers area of Normandy. William de Noers accompanied William the Conqueror in 1066 and thereafter settled in England. Harry Alexander Davis, *The Norris Family of Maryland & Virginia: Genealogy of Thomas Norris 1361 - 1930, Volumes I-IV* (Library of Congress: Washington D.C., 1941 [Transcript]) is reputedly the most comprehensive source on the Norris family.
²John Gough (1524-1562)'s forbears originated in Res Radnorshire, on the border of England and Wales. The name Gough was originally Goch in Old English. His ancestor Sir John Will Goch, was a Captain of the Welsh archers who defended Wales against the invading Norman army of William the Conqueror. Ilo Goch (c1320-

-1398) was court poet to Owen Glendower, the last native Prince of Wales. The sons of Sir Matthew Gough (1386-1450) left Wales to settle in Staple, Wiltshire England.
³This conjecture of identity is based on the shared familial patterns of inherited names, slaveholding practices, and slave trade commerce between these two regions. There are no Jamaica birth, marriage or death records for Thomas Norris (1745-?).
⁴I could find no records of Sir John Bloomfield Gough's early military or administrative activities other than those he undertook in Jamaica. There I found records of his three early liaisons, but no birth, death or immigration records. This would fit with historical accounts, which mention only his later military exploits after 1840 on behalf of the British Raj in India. The documentation lends credence to the family lore that he eloped with the Hindu Isabella King from India to Jamaica in order to escape both Indian and British caste sanctions. That he left her a plantation with 22 slaves would also explain the source of the Norris family wealth.
